

## Street Pastor input, figures and statistics for 2016

In 2016 Vennture Street Pastors interacted with **600 people** of those they further helped **410 people** through **serious incidents**.

Street Pastors are tied up in a serious incident for an average of 20 minutes.

**131 Street Pastor teams** of 3 people were sent out over **80 nights** in 2016. We covered all Saturdays and Bank holidays of 2016 and 50% of the Fridays.

Street Pastors cleaned up **1,290** broken, full or empty **bottles**, handed out **688** pairs of flip flops and **824** bottles of water.

On the relational side Street Pastors had **2,254 conversations with establishments, 1,784** with **members of the public** of which **279** people asked **'What's a Street Pastor'** and **763** people said **'Thank you'**.
